- 2. What level of disturbance will be made (noise, machinery, etc.)
- 3. Gas questions david says it is covered.
- 4. Clarifying warranties between companies and what they cover. Jasper points out that there is no warranty on Cornell on the connection to the existing system asks that this is looked into.
- 5. Damage to sidewalk or surrounding areas who covers that. How would that affect cost.
- 6. Why sewer renewal wanted to tear up the sidewalk and why the other contractors chose not to.

Decision was made with 13 green cards and Camilla had a yellow card. Camilla put a yellow card because she felt like she didn't get all the information she was expected to get in the meeting and feels unsure about the amount of information.

## Comments not questions:

 Camilla is concerned that by having a cap on the cost in the proposal that we will be stuck with a incomplete project and B & G will not be able to complete the repair.
